## **Whole School News**

### **Car Park**

Please can I ask parents to drive with extreme care and caution around the school car park. The safety of the children is of paramount importance and to that end I would like to make you aware of the following points:

- As soon as you drive in to school please be aware that the speed limit is 5mph.
- Please stop at pedestrian crossings when children and parents are trying to cross.
- Please park your car in a parking space and be particularly vigilant when reversing out.
- Please do not use the dropping zones as a parking space, particularly during the 5.30pm pick-up.
