

ABOUT BLUNDELL'S



The two Blundell's Schools are co-educational throughout and situated on the outskirts of the small market town of Tiverton in Devon. They occupy two adjoining sites covering some 120 acres, with some shared facilities (e.g. swimming pool, astro-turf pitches and theatre).

The Preparatory School at Milestones operates from Monday to Friday and consists of a Nursery & Pre-Prep (3–7 years) with 96 pupils and a Prep (7–11 years) of 145 pupils.

On the old site at Horsdon, Blundell's Senior School is academically organised as an 11–18 education. School House (11–13 years) has its own pastoral area (including dedicated full boarding facilities) with lessons Monday to Friday – there are some sports fixtures on Saturdays which selected pupils are expected to be available for. The main school (13–18 years) academic programme operates Monday to Saturday, with all pupils having games on Saturday afternoon.

In 1604 Blundell's was founded on Uplowman Green and endowed by the will of wealthy clothier, Peter Blundell – the aim was to provide schooling for 150 protestant grammar scholars. His good friend, Sir John Popham was the Executor of his will and he oversaw the building of "Ye Olde Fine School" in his hometown of Tiverton.

1882 The school relocated to its current site at Horsdon and the pupil role quickly increased to 280 by 1891

The beautiful campus covers approximately 120 acres on the outskirts of the small market town. The 600+ pupils today form a vibrant and happy community, who enjoy a genuinely all-round education built on over 400 years of history.

METHODS OF ENTRY



11+ ENTRY (see page 9)
By the Blundell's Entrance Tests in English, Mathematics and the New Group Reading Test. These are taken in January at Blundell's - earlier acceptances are possible by arrangement. Late entrants can be tested separately by arrangement, dependent on places still being available.



13+ ENTRY (see page 10)
By the Blundell's Entrance Tests
in English and Mathematics or
via the scholarship programme –

16+ ENTRY (see page 12)
The minimum requirement for entry to the Sixth Form is at least 6 GCSE passes at grade 6 or above. We also require at least a grade 7 in any subject to be taken at A2 level. A report will be requested from the present school and, where possible, candidates will be interviewed at Blundell's. There are various scholarship options available.

REGISTRATION

A Registration Form is available from a.gray@blundells.org; this requires a non-refundable fee of £100 (no fee for Blundell's Prep School or Foundation Bursary applicants). All pupils taking entrance examinations, at any level, must be registered prior to the examination.

This reserves a provisional place for your child, conditional on satisfying the entrance criteria, and enters your details on our computer. You will then receive termly updates on events such as Head's Guest Mornings, concerts, open days, plays, school matches and curriculum developments. This will obviously enable us to keep communication channels very much open and help to keep our records up to date with your intentions and changes of circumstances/address etc.

ACCEPTANCE

Once a place has been formally offered, you will be asked to complete an Acceptance Form (parent contract), medical questionnaire and forward a £500 deposit - £1,500 for EU and £6,000 outside the UK & EU - (the deposit is refunded on completion of a child's education at Blundell's); Foundation Scholars are the only exemptions to the deposit. Your new pupil documents will be sent to you in early July prior to your child's arrival.

ACADEMIC AWARDS

A small number of academic awards will be offered to those who excel in the Award Papers. These awards can be up to 20% of the fees and will last for 2 years, pupil performance is reviewed annually.

FOUNDATION BURSARIES

Blundell's is fortunate to be able to offer a number of Foundation Bursaries to successful applicants whose parents need financial assistance. These awards are competed for via the 11+ Awards and take the form of a fee reduction. All Bursary Awards are subject to the School's ability to fund them within the context of its overall budget, and therefore levels cannot be guaranteed. Candidates are requested to visit the school before the closing date for the 11+ examinations. Foundation applicants should be registered as per normal, however, they are exempt from paying the registration fee.

MUSIC AWARDS

Music Awards at 11+ will be held in the Spring Term and will usually entail an audition and interview. Candidates should bring their instruments with them and music for the accompanist if required. Music Awards continue into the Senior School.

Candidates at 11+ should be able to offer one or two instruments or voice. As a guide, Grade 3+ would be advised and if presenting one instrument it would be expected to be more advanced. Considerable importance is also attached to general musical knowledge, aural ability and sight reading. Choral Awards are awarded to singers and they may apply without an instrumental second instrument. Candidates will be required to play two contrasting pieces on their first study plus another piece of their choice on their second study. Music Award holders are expected to make a valuable contribution to the musical life of the School, Parents and Head Teachers are invited to contact the Director of Music for further information and advice.

CURRICULUM

In Years 7 & 8, pupils study 18 different subjects to give them experience of a wide range of courses. They also partake in the 'Roots and Wings' extension and enrichment programme, which challenges them in topics not covered in the classroom.

FOUNDATION BURSARIES

Blundell's is fortunate to be able to offer Foundation Bursaries to successful scholarship applicants whose parents need financial assistance to afford a place at the school for their son or daughter. Assessment will be through the 13+ scholarship examination and an online bursary application. Candidates are requested to visit the school

before the closing date for the 13+ examinations. Foundation applicants should be registered as per normal, however, they are exempt from paying the registration fee.

External candidates who are not entered for the academic scholarships must satisfy the entry requirements by sitting the Blundell's Entry Test or by Common Entrance. Please apply via the school website or email a.gray@blundells.org.

ART SCHOLARSHIPS

13+ Art Scholarships will be held in January. Candidates should submit an art portfolio (max 5 pieces) 4 weeks in advance of their interview and a letter of support/reference from their Art teacher. Assessment is made by interview and a 1 hour observational drawing test. Scholars will be expected to continue studying the subject until GCSF level.

MUSIC SCHOLARSHIPS

Music Scholarships at 13+ will be held in January and will usually entail an audition and interview. Candidates should bring their instruments with them and music for the accompanist if required.

Candidates at 13+ should be able to offer one or two instruments or voice. As a guide, Grade 5+ would be advised and if presenting one instrument it would be expected to be more advanced. Considerable importance is also attached to general musical knowledge, aural ability and sight reading. Choral Scholarships are awarded to singers and they may apply without an instrumental second instrument. Candidates will be required to play two contrasting pieces on their first study plus another piece of their choice on their second study. Music Scholars are expected to make a valuable contribution to the musical life of the School, Parents and Head Teachers are invited to contact the Director of Music for further information and advice.

SPORT SCHOLARSHIPS

Sports Scholarships at 13+ will be held in October and are offered for excellence in sport. A Curriculum Vitae detailing the candidate's sporting achievements must be submitted with the scholarship application form. School reports will be requested in support of the candidate's application and external candidates will be expected to take the Blundell's Entry Tests in English and Mathematics.

Scholarships will be made to those who will make an active contribution to the sporting life of the school. They will be expected to provide leadership at their own level and will have achieved or be of a standard to achieve representative honours at County, Regional or National level.

DRAMA SCHOLARSHIPS

Drama Scholarships at 13+ will be held in January. Assessment is made by interview and observation of practical performance skills and includes a group exercise. Candidates should prepare in advance, a short monologue of no more than two minutes. They will be seen individually for a further 5-10 minutes by the Head of Drama.

The successful candidate(s) will have demonstrated the skilful use of body and voice to characterise a role or roles and the ability to work creatively with others. They should demonstrate genuine interest in the subject and the determination to succeed, and they will be expected to continue studying the subject until GCSE level.

DESIGN & TECHNOLOGY SCHOLARSHIPS

Design & Technology Scholarships will be held in January. Applicants are expected to take the subject for GCSE.

There are limited scholarship places available and the process of applying consists of the following stages:

- Submission of a concise portfolio of Maximum 2 A3 pages submitted online in PDF format.
- Invitation to sit a short assessment focusing on design and problemsolving ability. Assessment to last 45 minutes
 - consisting of a design task to explore, rationalise and suggest a solution to a design problem.
- 2 hour practical assessment.
- Interview with a member of D&T ctaff

Successful applicants who are shortlisted from the portfolio and design focused assessment task will be interviewed by a member of teaching staff from the D&T Department.

CURRICULUM

At GCSE, pupils will have the opportunity to study up to eleven subjects from the twenty available, with English Language and Literature, Mathematics and a minimum of two Science subjects studied by all pupils. Selection of GCSE courses is made during Year 9 with support from tutors, Academic Head of Years 9-11 and the Careers Department. This ensures appropriate choices are made to act as a foundation for study in the Sixth Form and beyond.

These will include a computer-based cognitive ability test, a paper in a specialist subject of their choice and papers in Mathematics and English. They will also be interviewed.

FOUNDATION BURSARIES

Blundell's is fortunate to be able to offer Foundation Bursaries to successful scholarship applicants whose parents need financial assistance to afford a place at the school for their son or daughter.

Assessment will be through the 16+ scholarship examination and an online bursary application. Candidates are requested to visit the school before the closing date for the 16+ examinations. Foundation applicants should be registered as per normal, however, they are exempt from paying the registration fee.

SPORT SCHOLARSHIPS

A Curriculum Vitae detailing the candidate's sporting achievements is required and a school report will be requested. Candidates will be interviewed and their sporting ability tested.

Scholarships will be made to those who will make an active contribution to the sporting life of the school. They will be expected to provide leadership at their own level and will have achieved or be of a standard to achieve representative honours at County, Regional or National level.

ART SCHOLARSHIPS

Candidates should submit 5 pieces in advance of the assessment via Microsoft Lens. They will be interviewed by the Director of Art. There will be a 1 hour observational drawing test.

DRAMA SCHOLARSHIPS

Candidates should prepare in advance, a short monologue of no more than two minutes followed by a 10 minute interview.

MUSIC SCHOLARSHIPS

These will entail an audition and interview. Candidates should bring their instruments with them and music for the accompanist if required.

STEM (Science, Technology, Economics and Mathematics) SCHOLARSHIPS

The STEM scholarship aims to engage talented and ambitious pupils in A-level subjects such as D&T, Maths, Physics and Chemistry and who wish to enter the world of industrial design, engineering and architecture.

Applicants must take Product Design at A-level alongside a minimum of one other STEM subject (Maths, Physics or Chemistry). Assessment is via a portfolio, interview plus:

- Design focused, problem solving paper
- Maths Paper

CURRICULUM

In the Sixth Form pupils choose three or four subjects from a choice of at least 27 to study during Year 12. Some subjects may require a minimum number of students to be viable. Most pupils will then concentrate on three subjects in Year 13.



OUR SMALL CLASSES ENSURE STAFF HAVE TIME TO SPEND WITH EACH INDIVIDUAL PUPIL, UNDERSTANDING AND RESPONDING TO THEIR PARTICULAR NEEDS. WE KNOW THAT OUR PUPILS HAVE DIFFERENT STRENGTHS, AND WE TAKE GREAT CARE IN FINDING WAYS TO BUILD ON THESE STRENGTHS THROUGHOUT OUR CURRICULUM.

WE ALSO HAVE A UNIQUE AND STRUCTURED ENRICHMENT PROGRAMME THAT RUNS THROUGH THE SCHOOL.

YEARS 7 AND 8 - School House pupils take part in our 'Roots and Wings' academic enrichment programme on Wednesday afternoons. Without the constraint of timetabled lessons there are a huge variety of activities and learning opportunities on offer, inspiring pupils to find at least one thing each term that absolutely inspires them - such as

Bletchley Park Enigma Machine demonstrated by cryptographers,

YEARS 9-11 - pupils can join our 'Phoenix Society - for the intellectually curious' - it is open to all who are interested in extending themselves. Pupils have a wide variety of experiences and challenges, from visiting Hinkley Point power station to visiting the Houses of Parliament. Trips are organized to allow pupils to follow their passions and interests. Year 9 pupils have a lesson each week on 'Character' education, led by the Head. Year 10 and 11 have a program of 'Electives' during timetabled curriculum time where they experience a wide range of different activities to enhance their skills at learning and broaden their horizons on what education really is.

YEARS 11-13 - have a weekly enrichment programme involving a range of compulsory and optional talks. The aim is to challenge, inspire and promote well-rounded young people by offering multifarious stimuli every Friday afternoon, delivered by members of staff and/or outside speakers – such as:

The power of creative industries

Astronomy

How to Learn

Banking & the City

Applying fo<mark>r Ox</mark>bridg<mark>e</mark> taken by an Oxford Don

Visits from environmental businesses

Sustainability lectures and discussions

Life Skill training - sessions in selfdefence, basic cookery skills, banking for students and interview techniques.

ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIP EXTENSION

We have a regular programme of stretching our most able; pupils who have academic scholarships are invited to evenings where they are cerebrally challenged, as well as scholars' working lunches in the Beale Centre, where they get to mix with like-minded pupils and have a lecture from an invited expert in a particular field.



GIFTED AND TALENTED PUPILS

Blundell's has a wide variety of entrance and screening tests, from the entry exams and scholarships to the MidYIS tests and regular departmental assessments. From these, and from many other sources, a group of gifted and talented pupils is identified. Members of staff supervise and work closely with this group across a wide range of differing and interesting issues. There is a similar arrangement for the Art, Music and Sports Scholars. These gifted and talented pupils are given the opportunity to join the Phoenix Society and are invited to the Scholars' Lunches and Enrichment Evenings.

The progress and interests of these pupils are monitored by their Tutors and the relevant Academic Heads. Senior pupils who have chosen to undertake an Extended Project are given a mentor to overseee their research. This is a qualification which carries the weighting of an AS level and is increasingly favoured by highly selective Universities. Those pupils interested in applying for Oxford or Cambridge are appropriately advised and supported in their application preparation.

COMMENDATIONS

Our pupil tracking system allows us to collect data on pupil effort and attainment each lesson and pupils who are working consistently well are rewarded by first their Tutor, their House Parent and, for exceptional work, by the Head.

HEAD'S MERITS AND HONOURS

For very strong pieces of work or service to the school, a Head's Merit or Honours Award can be given. The work is often presented to the Head and parents are notified of their child's success.

SCHOOL PRIZES

School Prizes are awarded on Speech Day at the end of the academic year. They cover not only subject awards but also recognise wider contributions to the School



NATIONAL ACADEMIC COMPETITIONS

Blundellians are entering more and more national academic competitions with increasing levels of success. A highlight was surely the team of Bill, Prad, Tilda and Harry in the National Maths Challenge. 1300 schools entered and having won the Regional round, defeating academically selective schools such as Colyton Grammar, Exeter Maths School and Exeter School, the team eventually finished a very creditable 42nd. Prad was also a finalist in UK Young Scientist of the Year with his project on Plant Pyrolysis for Energy. Other successes have come in winning the Ogden Physics (Devon), Maths Olympiads, RSC Chemistry Analysts, Ultimate STEM Challenge and British Physics Olympiads.



SCHOLARSHIPS AND AWARDS

ANY GREAT SCHOOL SHOULD NURTURE ACADEMIC PERFORMANCE THROUGH ENCOURAGEMENT OF SCHOLARSHIP AND SCHOLARLY EXAMPLE. AT BLUNDELL'S THERE IS A WIDE CROSS-SECTION OF AWARDS AIMED AT ENCOURAGING BALANCE, BREADTH AND A WILL TO LEAD FROM THE FRONT THROUGH ATTAINING THE HIGHEST STANDARDS.

Blundell's has foundation arrangements following the precepts of Peter Blundell himself. Four hundred years after his death, local students still go out from this school strengthened by the learning which was the important part of our founder's vision.

Whilst acknowledging that academic performance is of the greatest importance and all pupils must work towards high levels of achievement,

Blundell's also has a range of awards to reflect sporting, artistic or musical achievement. Whilst at Blundell's the holders should be shining examples within their individual field.

Scholars and Award holders at Blundell's are expected to give a lead. Each year performance is reviewed. Our programmes are adapted to give a wide vision and scholars should demonstrate a lively interest in the events designed to stretch them. Energy and an enquiring mind are vital to the fulfilment of potential. There is an extensive Gifted and Talented programme throughout the School and the Phoenix Society provides further stimulus for the intellectually curious.

AT WHAT AGE CAN A BOY OR GIRL SIT FOR AN AWARD?

Awards are made at the following stages in a child's education:

- at 11+ for entry into School House (the Junior Department); pupils are in Year 6 when they take the exam and must be under 12 on the 1st September of the year of entry.
- at 13+ for entry into the Senior School; pupils are in Year 8 when they take the exam and must be under 14 on the 1st September of the year of entry.
- at 16+ for entry into the Sixth Form; pupils are in Year 11 when they take the exam and must be under 17 on the 1st September of the year of entry.

WHAT ARE THE VALUE OF SCHOLARSHIPS AND AWARDS?

- 11+ Academic and Music Awards are up to 20% of the fees.
- 13+ Scholarships are up to 30% of the fees. Exhibitions are up to 10% of the fees.
- 16+ Scholarships are up to 30% of the fees. Exhibitions are up to 10% of the fees.

WHAT ARE NAMED SCHOLARSHIPS?

The prestigious Named Scholarships are funded by generous donations from benefactors.

WHAT IS A FOUNDATION BURSARY?

The School is fortunate to be able to offer these to successful scholarship applicants whose parents need financial assistance for their son or daughter and who, in the opinion of the Head, would derive great benefit from an education at Blundell's. This bursary is means tested and offers a discount of up to 100% of basic tuition fees. Parents and candidates must arrange to visit the School and complete an online bursary application form prior to the examination closing date.

DO AWARDS MADE AT 11+ CONTINUE INTO THE SENIOR SCHOOL?

All 11+ Awards are for 2 years, apart from Music, which continues into the Senior School

CAN A PUPIL WHO HOLDS AN AWARD TRY FOR ONE AGAIN AT A LATER STAGE?

Candidates who win an award at 11+ are reviewed annually and should automatically become 13+ Scholars. They can sit for one at 13+ to see if he or she can improve. If a higher standard is achieved, relative to their age, then a higher award can be made. However, the original award will not be lost if the reverse is true! This is also the case at 16+.

CAN INTERNAL CANDIDATES APPLY FOR A SCHOLARSHIP?

Pupils in Year 8 or Year 11 may apply to sit the scholarship examinations even if they failed to receive an award at an earlier stage. Pupils are not automatically entered, however, and must apply by the appropriate closing date.

WILL BLUNDELL'S REQUEST A SCHOOL REPORT?

On receipt of the scholarship application form, Blundell's will request a confidential report from the candidate's current school and this will form an important part of the assessment process.

WHERE DO THE EXAMS TAKE PLACE?

All exams are sat at Blundell's. When candidates live abroad it may be possible, given enough notice, to arrange for papers to be sat at the candidate's school or to be supervised online.

WILL MY CHILD BE ABLE TO STAY AT BLUNDELL'S DURING THE SCHOLARSHIP EXAMINATIONS?

Candidates may stay in a boarding house overnight during the examination period.

OVERSEAS STUDENTS

WHILE BLUNDELL'S REMAINS THE PRE-EMINENT "SCHOOL OF CHOICE" IN DEVON AND CORNWALL, IT MAINTAINS ITS GLOBAL PERSPECTIVE AND INTERNATIONAL OUTLOOK.

Throughout its 400 year history Blundell's has provided for pupils from overseas. Improvements in travel and communication over the last two decades, has produced a wider range of International students than in the past and they usually make up about 18% of the total number. Overseas students are fully integrated into the school and the boarding houses are always open at weekends, even on Leave Weekends. All overseas students require a UK based Guardian. Prospective students can expect to be tested in English and Mathematics before entry and by interview if at all possible.

One of our greatest Old Blundellian benefactors, Sir Christopher Ondaatje OC, CBE, when opening the magnificently appointed Ondaatje Theatre, declared his wish that the building should symbolise international understanding and accord. We feel we are offering a truly international education whilst restricting numbers of students from each country so that the ethos of an English boarding school is enriched rather than diluted. Friendships quickly spring up between the English and International students at Blundell's, leading to greater understanding for all.

1 year students are accepted in all years if beds are available.

1 term students are accepted only in exceptional circumstances and when a bed is available - often possible in years 7 & 8.

THE AIMS OF THE INTERNATIONAL COMMITTEE ARE TO PROMOTE INTEGRATION AND TO HELP ALL INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS SETTLE INTO THE BLUNDELL'S WAY OF LIFE

The International Committee is run by the senior overseas pupils themselves within the International Hub and they help to provide role models for the younger or new pupils. They meet regularly and put on social and cultural events in the evenings to help boarders to integrate. These have included Welcome Evenings, Moon Festival and International Games Evenings. Yearly events have included European Day of Languages, Chinese New Year and Diwali celebrations. They often co-ordinate with the kitchen staff to provide food associated with their home countries during these cultural celebrations and they make presentations to the whole school community to promote international understanding.

The new International Hub provides a central area where all international pupils will feel welcome and supported. They can drop in for a chat at any time and always find a friendly face within the EAL team, who will help and advise them – there is very rarely a problem that cannot be solved by our staff as long as they know about them.

The School arranges a coach to pick up pupils from Heathrow on the first day of each half of term at 11.30am and 6.30pm. There is also a coach to take pupils to Heathrow by 11.30am on the last day of each half of term. These coaches can be booked via the Second Master's PA.

Recent highlights for the boys rugby have included a National Champions Trophy Final and winning the U18 Rosslyn Park National Sevens.

Our aspiration is for every pupil to find a sport that they enjoy and that they will continue to play after their time at Blundell's. The main sport for boys in the Autumn Term is Rugby and for girls Hockey, although the choice widens as the pupils move up through the school. In the Spring Term boys have the opportunity to compete in teams in Hockey, Football, Fives, Rugby Sevens and Squash and girls Netball, Fives, Rugby Sevens and Squash. In the Summer Term the main sports are Cricket and Tennis, but we also run highly successful Athletics and Swimming

teams at all age groups. Blundell's also run teams in Cross-Country, Golf, Equestrian and Rounders. For those who like to exercise in a less competitive environment there is plenty of opportunity for senior pupils to use our fitness suite, and to take part in fitness related activities such as Pilates and recreational Badminton and Table Tennis.

MUSIC AT BLUNDELL'S LEADS YOU TO THE VERY GREATEST OPPORTUNITIES: SINGING IN CARNEGIE HALL, NEW YORK, REACHING THE FINALS OF THE NATIONAL CHORAL COMPETITION, PLAYING ALONGSIDE THE LONDON CHAMBER ORCHESTRA IN PROFESSIONAL CONCERT HALLS AND MORE. MUSIC PLAYS AN INTEGRAL PART OF LIFE AT BLUNDELL'S AND THERE ARE MANY OPPORTUNITIES FOR MUSICAL PUPILS TO PERFORM IN VARIOUS ENSEMBLES. THERE ARE THREE CHOIRS, THREE ORCHESTRAS, TWO JAZZ BANDS AND A HOST OF OTHER BRASS, STRING AND WIND ENSEMBLES.

We cater for all musical interests and abilities, be it classical, folk, rock, pop, jazz or world music. There are many concerts both formal and informal, where all musicians have the opportunity to perform before an audience of parents, supportive friends and the wider community. There are also major public concerts each year in prestigious venues, including recently at Exeter Cathedral and St George's Bristol.

Academic Music is an area of strength, with the majority of pupils achieving grade A*-B in A Level Music and A*-A at GCSE. The recent extension to the Music Department has greatly enhanced the facilities for both performing and recording musicians: we now have two Mac composition suites and a recording studio as well as 12 practice rooms, each with a piano. Music is taught to all pupils in Year 7, 8 and 9 and then becomes an option for GCSE, A-level Music and A-level Music Technology. Our pupils regularly go on to read Music at conservatoires or top universities.

Pupils are able to have one-to-one lessons in a wide range of instruments including piano, organ, all orchestral and jazz instruments, percussion, acoustic and electric guitar, singing, theory and Alexander Technique.

There are over 350 music lessons a week at Blundell's, and the department is a thriving and creativelystimulating environment.

There are international trips each year, including the most recent tour to New York, where the Chamber choir gave a concert in Carnegie Hall. Other recent trips have included Budapest, Vienna, Barcelona, and Tuscany.

A major choral and orchestral work is performed annually and there is a musical production every year.

Every opportunity is taken to ensure that our musicians thrive in a dynamic department committed to creativity, enthusiasm and quality where fun and enjoyment is coupled with musical excellence.

THE EXCELLENT ONDAATJE HALL, A PURPOSE BUILT THEATRE, PROVIDES THE HOME FOR THE VERY POPULAR DRAMA DEPARTMENT. PUPILS STUDY DRAMA AS PART OF THE WHOLE SCHOOL CURRICULUM AND THEY ARE PROVIDED WITH A RICH AND DIVERSE EXPERIENCE OF THE HISTORICAL, CULTURAL AND PRACTICAL ASPECTS OF DRAMA AND THEATRE STUDIES. DRAMA IS OFFERED AT BOTH GCSE AND A LEVEL. DRAMA CLASSES ARE TAUGHT IN THE SPECIALLY EQUIPPED TEACHING SPACES BY STAFF WHO ARE EITHER SUBJECT SPECIALISTS IN THEIR OWN RIGHT, OR WHO HAVE UNDERTAKEN ADDITIONAL TRAINING IN THE TEACHING OF DRAMA.



There are three major school productions per year: a School House production, a Year 9&10 production and a senior school production. Open auditions are held for these. The plays are directed by a member of the drama department, and are supported by the expertise of other staff members as well as external professionals with specific specialist skills such as choreography,





ART AT BLUNDELL'S

ART ENABLES STUDENTS TO FIND THEIR OWN VISUAL LANGUAGE, DEVELOP IMAGINATION AND AWARENESS. ART IS APPRECIATION OF DIFFERENCES AND DIVERSITY; A DEVELOPMENT OF EMPATHY AND VALUING THE VIEWS OF OTHERS. ART IS PERSONAL AND EXCITING, CREATING THINKERS, COMMUNICATORS AND PROBLEM SOLVERS. ART CHALLENGES THE NORM AND LEARNS FROM THE CHALLENGERS.

The impressively modern Art Department adjoins the Ondaatje Theatre and the Popham Centre. It comprises four large studios giving opportunities for the development of skills in drawing, painting, 3-D design, sculpture, printmaking, kiln formed glass, digital photography and ceramics. There is also a dark-room and an excellent purpose-built computer room and research library. Students gain inspiration from trips to galleries, both locally and further afield (most recently to London and Paris) and from workshops led by visiting professional artists in a wide variety of media. In addition the senior students study Life Drawing and take part in the Royal Academy outreach workshops each year. The ethos of the department is to foster creativity and curiosity in Art,

enabling students to appreciate the work of others, express themselves and develop a wide range of practical skills. These are supported by specialist teaching staff and a full time Art technician. There is an extensive range of artistic activities such as Glass Club, Ceramics, Drawing Club, Weaving, Coursework and examination support/ extension sessions, and Special Art Status (for Scholars and those identified as being gifted and talented in Art). Art Scholars are expected to lead exhibitions, community outreach and enter local and National competitions where the department has enjoyed great success. At GCSE, Art and Design is offered with both Fine Art and Photography endorsements. At A Level, both Fine Art and Photography are offered as separate A Levels.

ACTIVITIES AT BLUNDELL'S

THE SCHOOL'S STATEMENT OF AIMS AND VALUES STRESSES THE IMPORTANCE OF THE WHOLE INDIVIDUAL AND THEREFORE WE PLACE A STRONG EMPHASIS ON ENCOURAGING PUPILS TO DEVELOP A WIDE RANGE OF INTERESTS AND ENTHUSIASMS. THIS IS ACHIEVED THROUGH A VARIETY OF WAYS. THE ACTIVITIES PROGRAMME OFFERS A DIVERSE RANGE OF OPPORTUNITIES, FOR EXAMPLE COMMUNITY SERVICE, ASTRONOMY, JOURNALISM, RIDING AND ARCHERY. WE ENCOURAGE THE PUPILS TO TRY SOMETHING NEW AS NOW IS THE TIME TO BROADEN THEIR HORIZONS. IT IS NORMAL FOR PUPILS TO HAVE TWO ACTIVITY SESSIONS A WEEK AND THE EXPECTATION IS THAT, WITH THE HELP AND GUIDANCE OF THEIR TUTOR, THEY WILL GAIN A BROAD EDUCATION.

OUTDOOR ACTIVITIES

There are numerous outdoor activities which take place outside the weekly Activity sessions; the Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme, the Ten Tors' Challenge and the Devizes to Westminster canoe challenge are examples of activities which are well supported by the pupils.

ADVENTURE AND LEADERSHIP PROGRAMME

Blundell's is very much committed to providing purposeful and exciting activities for our boarders at weekends. This exciting new initiative provides a series of eight weekend activities over the course of the year leading towards a three-day expedition in the summer that will make use of the skills learned. The personal qualities this programme seeks to impart are very much in demand by employers as an adjunct to traditional academic qualifications and it provides an outstanding opportunity to develop useful skills while having a great deal of fun. It also leads towards an ASDAN qualification. Examples of the activities are gorge-walking, leadership challenges, navigation, survival training, surfing and teambuilding games.

INTELLECTUAL, CREATIVE AND PRACTICAL ACTIVITIES

As would be expected there are many opportunities for pupils to explore these areas of interest. Again we would encourage pupils to broaden their curiosity. There are many societies here at Blundell's. They allow the pupils to develop their interests outside the classroom; examples would include the Astronomy Society, the Chemistry Club, the History Society, the Business Club, the Art Club, the Economics Society, and the Poetry Society. Members of staff are always willing to help pupils establish new societies should they wish.

The School Calendar gives details of the numerous lectures, public speaking competitions, debating, musical performances, plays, art exhibitions and other cultural events. As with all events in the Calendar parents are most welcome to attend the public performances. If day pupils are required to stay for an activity in the evening they are entitled to have supper in the Dining Hall.

COMBINED CADET FORCE (CCF)

Through the use of military based training and activities, the CCF seeks to promote essential qualities such as responsibility, self-reliance, resourcefulness, endurance and perseverance. As part of the School's commitment to fostering personal development and leadership skills, cadets at Blundell's spend a compulsory service period with the CCF, starting in the Summer Term of Year 9. After this time, membership becomes voluntary, and many cadets choose to stay with us and gain additional responsibilities as senior cadets. As well as military based training activities there are also plenty of opportunities for Adventurous Training and the opportunity to take part in the Duke of Edinburgh's Award Scheme. In Years 9 and 10, cadets are encouraged to complete the DofE Bronze Award, and the CCF is ideally suited to support Silver and Gold DofE level activities in Years 11, 12 and 13. The Contingent Commander is Mr B.A. Dawe MBE, and the CCF is run by members of the School staff, supported by regular Army NCO's from the local Cadet Training Team. Training takes place on Monday afternoons, and there are also regular trips, visits and field training exercises off site, there is also a week long annual camp each summer. The contingent is currently Single Service (Army), but has links with all three services.

MINIBUS ROUTES



BY AIR

Excellent International links

The international airport at Bristol is only 60 minutes from Blundell's by car and the nearby regional airport at Exeter is only 20 minutes away. Coaches operate every 30 minutes between Heathrow and Reading railway station to connect with the direct mainline train service from Paddington to Tiverton Parkway.

BY RAIL

Main lines serving most of England

Nearby Tiverton Parkway is on the Paddington to Penzance and South West to the North of England mainlines. Typical times to the following destinations are: Bristol 60 minutes, Plymouth 75 minutes and central London is only 2 hours away. The station is only a 6 minute taxi journey to Blundell's.

BY ROAD

6 minutes from the M5

Blundell's is 6 minutes from Junction 27 of the M5. Take the A 361 (North Devon Link Rd) towards Barnstaple. Take the first exit signed to Tiverton (after 5 miles) and at the second roundabout take the B 3391 towards Halberton.



Built in 2018, the modern fully equipped Medical Centre is in the middle of the campus. It is led by the School Doctor and Senior Nurse with a highly skilled team of 8 qualified nurses, who provide 24 hour supervision when required. It is fully equipped with consulting rooms and en-suite isolation rooms.

All full and weekly boarders are registered at the local Clare House Surgery and there is a doctor's surgery every morning, but all pupils are seen on a walk-in basis. Additional medical support is provided by Tiverton Hospital (2 miles) and the Royal Devon & Exeter Hospital (20 miles).

Blundell's is committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of young people and expects all staff and volunteers to share this commitment. Each house is allocated a named link nurse, who will liaise with House staff regarding medical and health issues. There is also a full time School Counsellor available throughout the week

International Boarding Fee includes UKVI administration costs (CAS fee etc), Transport to and from Heathrow each half-term and to IELTs testing centres, and Boarders' Sunday trips and activities

FULL BOARDER - A pupil who normally stays 7 days a week with his/her own allocated bed and study area. Laundry, all meals and some weekend activities are included in the fee.

WEEKLY BOARDER - A pupil who stays from Monday to Friday inclusive (Mon' to Thu' in School House), with the provision of his/her own allocated bed and study area. Laundry and all meals during the week are included in the fee. Weekend stays are possible at the normal Flexi-boarder nightly cost, billed at the end of term.

FLEXI-BOARDER - A Flexi-boarder can choose an 11 night or a 22 night per term package taken on any Monday to Friday night during the term. This will give them their own designated bed and the ability to stay for supper and prep on any weekday evening. Extra nights can be taken at £60.00 per night billed at the end of term. Laundry is not included in this fee.

DAY - A day pupil goes home at the end of the programmed day. Breakfast and/or supper and evening prep can be taken at an additional daily charge.

'LOCAL' fees apply to parent(s) with whom the child normally resides living within a ten mile radius of the school.

SIBLING DISCOUNTS: 7% off the elder of two, 10% off the eldest and 7% off the second of three. This includes pupils at Blundell's Preparatory School. If a pupil is awarded any other concession then this takes priority and any potential sibling discount ceases or does not apply. Sibling discount does not apply to pupils on the local fee tariff, which applies to Years 9-13 at the Senior School.

MILITARY AND DIPLOMATIC SERVICES BURSARY

Blundell's offers its own Services Boarding Package to support British Service families. The school has enjoyed a long and illustrious connection with the armed forces, and it continues to make the boarding community accessible financially for those who can claim the Continuity of Education Allowance.
